Bus & Absence Routines



You will notice signage in the parking areas and laneway of the school; please observe them to maximize student safety.

To reduce <u>morning</u> congestion in front of the school—and to avoid bus-car-truck conflicts—we want parents to drive into the second entrance (by the ice rink), 'drop' their children at the east end of the school, and then proceed out the 'main' entrance. We are hoping this will reduce the number of parent vehicles that are sometimes 'in the way' of the buses. Please do not drop-off your children before 8:20. Thank you for your cooperation!

As always let us know when your child is going to be absent; use the SafeArrival WRPS app, text the teacher, call the office or write a note in the agenda the day before. We need to know that your child is not going to be at school.

If you are making changes to the bus routine (for example, your child is going to a friend's house) you must tell us. We will not arrange a bus change based on your child's say so. If you are picking up your child at the end of the day, please wait at your vehicle until the buses depart; Mr. Teplyske will dismiss children to you once he recognizes you. It helps if you step out of your vehicle so that we can see your face.

It is so important for children to arrive 'on-time' for school. **Teachers begin formal teaching at 8:45**, but prior to that students have the opportunity to practice reading, writing, and math skills, and to get organized for the day. When children habitually arrive later than 8:30, their learning is impacted.



As you may know, Lakedell School has a Breakfast, Snack, and Lunch Program that is open to ALL students. The breakfast and lunch programs are intended to support students and families in need, without questions or qualifying information. Teachers have asked me to mention that children need enough food for three healthy (-ish) snacks daily as well as lunch.

Plains Cree Calendar Teaching

mikisew/kihew pisim

Eagle Month (February)

Mikisew/kihew is the first bird to come before coming alive, making way for geese and other birds that will follow and return from the south.



mikisew/kihew (eagle) & the family unit

This is a teaching about opikiyasowin (child rearing), and wahkotowin (kinship), important Cree values. It is also said that mikisew/kihew heralds the coming of other birds who arrive later in the spring, the smaller birds following behind it. Let go emotionally and mentally to that which is harmful and cluttering in a way that brings clarity and peace of mind.

If one part of the eagle is broken it cannot function. All parts are essential to the whole. If one person in a family is broken, like the eagle, it cannot soar. If one family is broken, it can break the community, and so on. When the whole is fractured, the community must pull together for healing and resurgence. It is especially important for the young to spend time with the old. When they are not connected then fractures will occur.
